In pursuit of this, African Studies takes, for example, a critical perspective to topics such as public culture, heritage and memory; questions accepted approaches to the archive and curation, develops new approaches to African literature and culture, critiques agrarian studies and approaches to land reform and redistribution. The recently introduced undergraduate programme include, among others, African Political Economy, African Political Thought, Language, Power and Freedom: Practices and Ideologies, as well as Representations of Africa.

The successful candidate for this position is expected to participate fully in all academic activities of the African Studies Section, including the introduction of critical pedagogies through teaching both undergraduate and postgraduate courses, and supervision of postgraduate students, and research.
