

Corona Programme

Due to the specific circumstances, we have prepared a new programme for this semester. The programme includes five online-sessions (zoom cloud meetings) and three written assignments. Please note:

- You will be invited to join the online session (make sure to download zoom)
- Details for every sessions (e.g. guidelines for assignment, papers etc uploaded on ADAM)
- If written assignments are requested, they must be uploaded on ADAM in the respective folder 3 days before the online session. (Start the document's name with your surname.)
- Attendance at all sessions and submitting the three assignments is required to get the credit points (note 3 CP, not 2CP as in the previous semesters)
- The sessions are scheduled to last max 90 minutes
- The colloquium will give you 3 credit points.

Session 1 – Wednesday 15th April 2020, 18:15-19:45

Topic: **“Asking for a continent” – Researching Covid-19 and previous epidemics in (southern) Africa in the age of digital/social media**

Form: Online discussion based on your reflective papers uploaded three days before

Assignment: 2-3 pages reflective paper (for details see the respective document on ADAM)

Session 2 – Wednesday 22nd April 2020, 18:15-19:45

Topic: **“Decision-making in Human-Wildlife Conflicts: Insides from Namibia”** (lecture by Katarina Rybarikova, University of Fribourg)

Form: Online lecture(!) by the author followed by a discussion.

Assignment: No specific assignment. However, active participation is required.

Session 3 – Wednesday 29th April 2020, 18:15-19:45

Topic: **“‘Skilled white bodies’: Portuguese workers in Angola as a case of North-South Migration”** (paper by Asaf Augusto, University of Bayreuth)

Form: Online discussion (ideally with the author but his presence is not yet confirmed)

Assignment: Read the paper (uploaded on ADAM). Prepare and upload two questions on ADAM.

Session 4 – Wednesday 13th May 2020, 18:15-19:45

Topic: **“Winning the Future for Whiteness: environmental ethnoscaping in South Africa”** (lecture by Scott Brunett, Lund University)

Form: Online lecture(!) by the author followed by a discussion.

Assignment: No specific assignment. However, active participation is required.

Session 5 – Wednesday 27th May 2020, 18:15-19:45

Topic: **Fishrot Scandal in Namibia**

Form: Online discussion based on your reflective papers uploaded three days before
