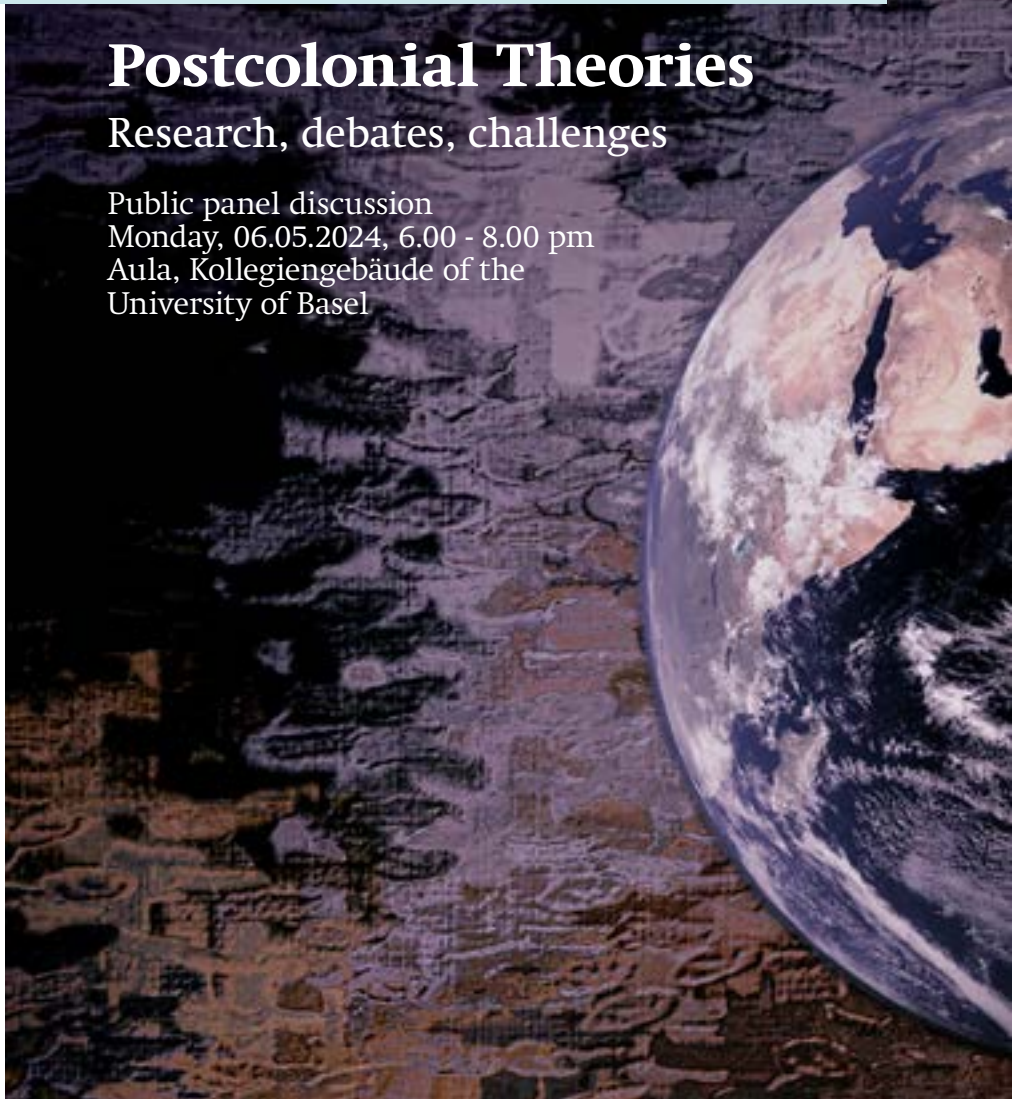

Public panel discussion

Recently, postcolonial theories have been criticised in various ways and sometimes with great vehemence. The current debate on postcolonial theories often proves to be polemical and characterised by both resentment and misunderstandings. The panel discussion sees itself as an intervention against simplifications and seeks a differentiated discussion about what postcolonial theories are, what they are capable of achieving and where their weaknesses lie.

The panel discussion will feature four researchers who all deal with postcolonial theories from different perspectives: Prof. Dr Falestin Naïli (Middle Eastern Studies, University of Basel); Prof. Dr Erik Petry (Centre for Jewish Studies, University of Basel), Dr Henri-Michel Yéré (Sociology, African Studies, University of Basel), PD Dr Kijan Espahangizi (Department of History, University of Zurich). The panel discussion will be moderated by Christoph Keller.
